
a nominating committee member comes calling. You won't regret it!

**Tubfrim** is closing. Lodges have been notified that the program will be ending operations the summer of 2023. Unfortunately this program has not made enough income to sustain itself.

**Tubrim** was established in 1928 at Nesbyen by postmaster Ditlef Fantzen. The collection and selling of stamps would be used for tuberculosis work among children of Norway.

In 1947, it was transferred to the National Association for Public Health. And in 1958, *Tubrim* built its own stamp house in Solstad. Today profits also go to the health and well-being measures for children and youth in Norway. Since its inception it has distributed NOK 26 million with approximately 2700 of good measures.

Please remember to save stamps and postcards for the *Tubfrim* program. Alice Svege will be collecting all contributions. When cutting the stamps out, leave a 1/4" margin around the stamp. They can also be sent to the *Tubfrim Chairperson*: Kjell Kittilsen, 871 70th Street, Brooklyn, NY 11228.

High school seniors and current college students- it's time to start thinking about 2023!

If you are a member of Sons of Norway or have a parent or grandparent who is a member, you can apply for a scholarship from the Sons of Norway Foundation.

There are a variety of scholarships available for college, trade schools, and study abroad, from \$1,500 to \$20,000+.

Go to the Sons of Norway Foundation website at <a href="https://www.sofn.com/foundation/scholarships/">https://www.sofn.com/foundation/scholarships/</a> to find out if you are eligible to apply. When you find one or more for which you qualify, read the Overview, Who Can Apply, and View Guidelines.

Here are a few suggestions for your scholarship application:

- Treat the application as if it is a job application. Be thorough in completing all of the requirements. Make a list of all the application requirements and check them off when completed. Then, double-check before submitting to be sure that it is complete.
- Read and study the Criteria section of the application. In your essay, you are asked to address six key points. Use specific, experiential examples when answering these key points, especially your connection to Sons of Norway.
- How did you find out about the Sons of Norway
   Foundation scholarship and/or what do you know
   about the Sons of Norway Foundation?
   Demonstrate that you've done research beyond a
   simple Google search.

Emphasize your involvement in community or school volunteer work.





## INFORMATION SHEET FOR THE ZONE 3 SCHOLARSHIP FUND

THE PURPOSE of the scholarship fund of Zone 3 is to grant a one-time award to promote and encourage the higher education of individuals who wish to pursue an education beyond the secondary school (high school) level.

THE AWARDS will be given directly to the successful candidates to be used by the recipient for expenses associated with the pursuit of the goal of further education. The number of scholarships to be awarded will depend on the Zone 3 Scholarship Fund available balance.

#### CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION OF APPLICATIONS

- 1. Application for an award from the Zone 3 Scholarship Fund will be considered by the Selection Committee in the following order of priority:
  - A. Active Member of a Zone 3 Lodge

    ("Agricus Member" is defined as a member
    - ("Active Member" is defined as a member who is on or has served on one of the Boards of his/ her lodge or Zone 3 and/or regularly attends meetings and supports the lodge and/or Zone at most events a member who takes and shows an active interest in the operation of his/her lodge and/or the Zone. This includes consideration for those members who have been active but may have become incapacitated and unable to participate.)
  - B. A member of a Zone 3 lodge OR child of an active Zone 3 Lodge member. ("Child" is defined as the son, daughter, grandchild, stepson, stepdaughter, or legally adopted child of a Zone 3 lodge member. A legal guardian will be considered a parent if he/she is solely responsible for the support of the applicant.)
  - C. Child of a Zone 3 Lodge member.
- 2. No award money will be given to any candidate until the Committee has received all the information required from the applicant including a copy of the <u>notification of acceptance</u> from the school to which the candidate has applied or <u>notification of attendance</u> from the school that the candidate is presently attending.
- 3. An applicant must submit each of the following items
  - A. An official transcript of academic record. The official transcript is imprinted with the school's seal and no transcript will be accepted without this seal. For high school seniors, this transcript should be a current high school transcript. If applicants are presently enrolled in higher education, submit a current college/school/university transcript
  - B. Three (3) letters of reference from the applicants' present or former professors, teachers, or instructors. Letters from relatives will not be accepted
  - C. Notification of acceptance or continued attendance of an educational institution where the applicant will be enrolled Summer/Fall 2023. This can be a college admission letter if the applicant is a high school senior, or else paperwork showing acceptance at an acceptable institution like the International Summer School at the University of Oslo, or paperwork showing that the applicant is a continuing student working toward a degree (for example, transcript showing intended Summer/Fall 2023 Coursework.
  - D. An essay written by the applicant.

Complete and return the application form and all required documentation prior to the deadline.

Complete applications must be received by May 1, 2023. Return the application form with all required information to: Kathleen Muller, 126 Raymond Pl., Staten Island, NY 10310.



## **NORSK HOT CHOCOLATE FROM 1875**



- 1000ml/33.8 fl oz milk
- 150g / 5.3 oz dark or plain chocolate
- 80g / 2.8 oz butter
- 100g / 3.5 oz sugar
- 1 egg volk
- Double or heavy cream to finish
- In a small bowl put aside 1 tablespoon of the milk. Heat the rest of the milk in a saucepan over a medium heat.
- Break the chocolate into pieces and add to the hot milk with the butter. Stir over a low heat until melted and then add the sugar. Stir well until melted.
- Beat the egg yolk into the milk you put to one side.
- Remove the hot chocolate from the heat and stir in the egg volk mixture. Stir for a minute to allow the hot milk to cook the egg yolk slightly but do this off the heat.
- Serve the hot chocolate whilst it's still warm and with a spoonful of whipped cream on the top for extra decadence.
