Camp applications and detailed information about camp has been emailed to each Secretary and Editor. If we do not have enough children enrolled in camp by the beginning of April, camp will have to be canceled for this year and that is something I do not want to have to do, as the youth are the future of our organization. We have to remember we no longer have Land of the Vikings anymore and the flexibility of owning our own campsite, so we are beholding to another organization to rent their facility, therefore campers can't wait to sign up for camp until the last minute as had been done in the past.

Continuing with my highlighting the members of the Third District Board, I would like to introduce you to Bill Browning, Zone 7 Director. Zone 7 includes lodges in Georgia, North and South Carolina, and

Virginia, and with that said here is what Bill has to say. Although new to the Board, Bill has been a very active Board member and never says no when asked to help.

Bill was born in Brooklyn and grew up in Brooklyn (Bay Ridge and Flatbush), Queens (Bayside) and spent his high school years on Long Island, attending Smithtown Central High School. Bill moved to Georgia in 1991 while working for Barnes and Noble in the book company's B. Dalton division. Within a few years he was working for NationsBank and then Bank of America as a fraud analyst.

In 2013 Bill, while starting to become interested in exploring his Norwegian heritage, had joined the Vennekretsen Lodge in Atlanta. By 2015 he had begun organizing the Trondheim Lodge in Roswell, GA. In January 2017, the two lodges, Vennekretsen and Trondheim, merged and Bill was elected president of the lodge. By membership vote, the lodge name was changed to Norskevenner the following month.

Bill has had lots of previous experience with group building and event staging. In Roswell he worked as the special events director for Barrington Hall, an historic house museum, staging several very successful Viking and Civil War reenactments. He also planned and managed Barrington Hall's history lecture series and cooking class series.

Currently Bill is organizing the nation-wide book club for Sons of Norway. He is also the Zone 7 Director and president of Norskevenner Lodge in Roswell, GA.



Thank you Bill, as you can see the District Board has very talented officers. Until next month I wish you all a great month of March.





ALICE'S NO BAKE SNOW-BALL CAKE



- 1-1/2 pkg. unflavored gelatin
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup fresh orange juice
- 1/4 cup of lemon juice
- 1 pint whipping cream
- Store bought Angel Cake
- Dissolve 1-1/2 package of unflavored gelatin in 1/4 cup tap water
- Add 1 cup boiling water and add a pinch of salt, 1 cup of sugar, 1 cup fresh orange juice and 1/4 cup of lemon juice
- Refrigerate gelatin until partially set
- Whip 1 pint of whipping cream until firm, fold 1/2 into jello
- Break up Angel Cake into bite size pieces
- Line medium mixing bowl with Saran Wrap
- Starting with gelatin mix, pour a small amount of mix into bowl and then add pieces of cake. Alternate mix and cake finishing with the gelatin mix on top.
- Cover with Saran Wrap and refrigerate over night
- Invert onto serving plate and dress with remaining whipping cream, and maybe some fruit!
